VINE Report: Tammara Slater/Terri Wedding- VINE registration has increased 45%, phone inquiries have increase 45% and email inquiries have increased 64% since ISA has started running the VINE program. They are still working to get Boundary and Jerome Counties online with the VINE program. VINE may call your jail if they think they may have lost the data connection. The question that they will ask the jail is if anyone has been booked in or out of your jail. If there is a problem they will start to troubleshoot the system.

N-DEX, LE National Data Exchange: Dawn Peck/ PK O'Neil- Record collection system that collects info from your RMS system. It will collect all records that you want to put into the system including contacts, citations and cases. This system is linked to LEO and is the process of being linked to RMIN. ILETS Conference is April 25th and 26th.

Shoshone-Paiute Resource Protection: Gary Aman- This program started 15 years ago but is now funded. The program is to protect sites and resources that are important to the Shoshone-Paiute Tribe. This program covers parts of Owyhee, Canyon, Ada, Elmore and Twin Falls Counties. Gary is currently the only person patrolling as part of this program. He has no law enforcement authority but works with the Counties and Federal Law Enforcement agencies. They will be hiring several more patrol rangers in the next few months. They will be hiring retired Federal and Local law enforcement officials.

Jail Commander's Association: Jay Davis/Clay Griffith- When reviewing their bylaws they found that there were some changes they would like to make. One of the things that they would like to change is the structure. They would like to have officers similar to the structure of the ISA with a president, 1st vice president, second vice president, secretary and past president. Motion to accept the concept that they are proposing with follow-up at the June meeting made by Sheriff Nielsen, second by Sheriff Ellis, motion passed.

US Marshal Report: Marshal Brian Underwood- They are here to support us. They have several areas that they can provide support. When working a violent or sexual type incident and the suspect has left the area they can assemble their task force and help look for the suspect. They can also assist with cross country transport but there is a fee for the service. They can assist with noncompliant sex offenders from across the country.

NACO: NACO President Glen Whitley- Asking for participation in NACO. There are 11 steering committees in NACO including one for Justice and Public Safety. Legislative conference is the first week of March 5-9 in Washington DC.

ISP: Colonel Jerry Russell- He is now back to work after his medical leave. He has been reappointed by the Governor.

Office of Drug Policy: Sharon Burke- Jack Barron from the Supreme Court and Jim Tibbs came with her. Rural meth initiative started in 2009 with a federal grant. The goals of the program are to identify Idaho as a High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas (HIDTA) State, make pseudoephedrine a scheduled drug and coalition building summits. They also want to improve the gang enforcement laws. Office of Drug Policy worked on the temporary spice ban and is working on the permanent ban. They are also working on the bath salt ban due to the developing problem with bath salts being used by kids as a drug. Senior Judge (retired) Jack Barron is working with the Office of Drug Policy and is the chair of the juvenile justice commission chair. Designer drugs have become a new major concern.
